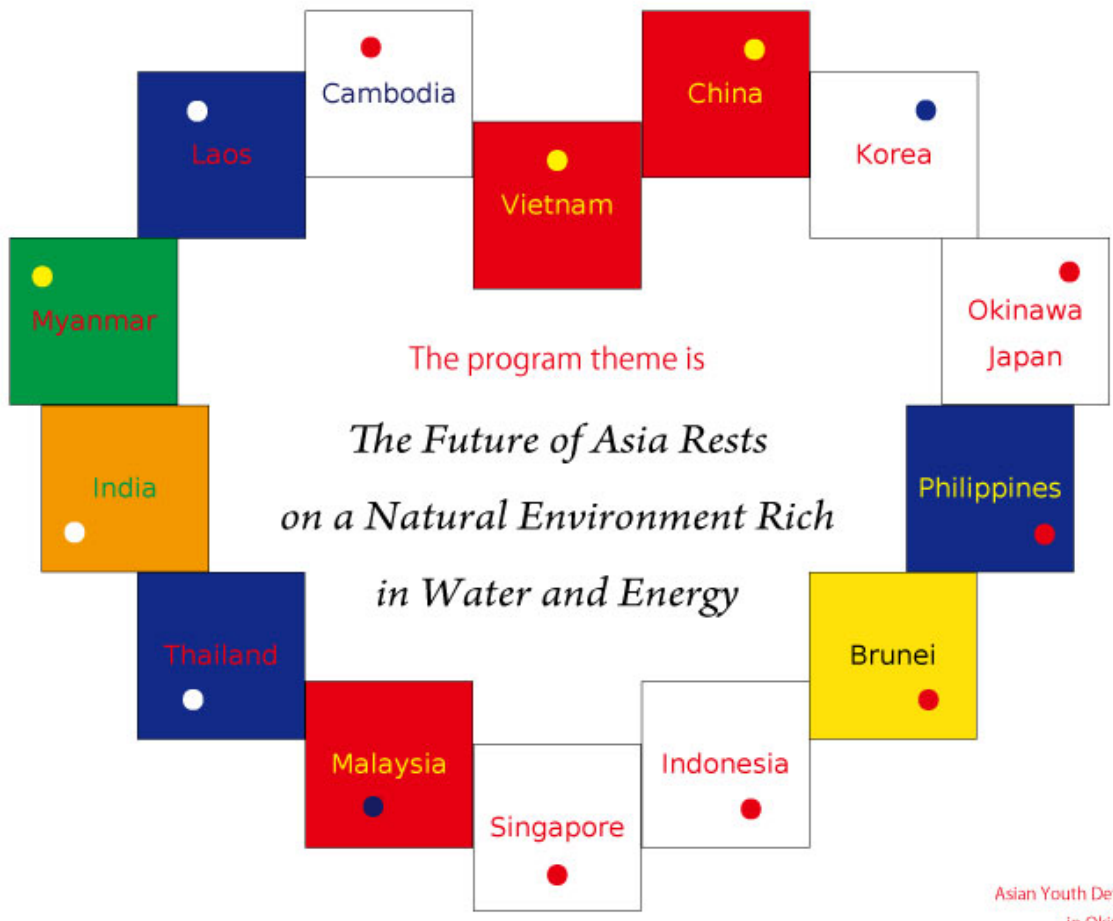

Declaration

Abstract

In our world, water is the most important aspect of life. Yet, many people both young and old, across the globe are still unaware of problems related to this necessity. Industrialization has damaged water sources and has created a development gap between nations. Both affect millions of people around the world every day.

Often, children with poor access to safe drinking water suffer serious health problems; this has resulted in one child dying of water borne diseases every three seconds. Many other children especially girls, cannot go to school and receive proper education as they have to walk for hours just to obtain water. Despite this, the water they collect is polluted with waste from factories and untreated sewage.

On the other hand, in many developed countries, people have easy access to water and therefore, they do not recognize the importance and scarcity of this precious resource. In contrast, many countries with less availability of water are in dispute over the usage of this resource.

Lastly as a result of pollution, various marine ecosystems are being threatened. Some species of aquatic life are endangered, some even facing extinction. Even in Okinawa, the coral reefs are being bleached due to global warming and water pollution.

Our vision for 2031 is a world devoid of these issues. It is a planet where everyone is aware of their responsibility to protect water sources as well as the earth's marine biology. It is a planet where everyone has access to adequate amounts of safe water and knowledge regarding all issues about this precious resource. It is a planet where every nation works closely together in improving the conditions of water across the earth.

To achieve this, we have created "Vision 2031", a declaration consisting of goals we wish to achieve and the actions we wish to implement to reach these targets. Our declaration consists of the following goals and actions:

- 1. Improved education regarding water-related issues*
- 2. Fair distribution of water*
- 3. Affordable technology to promote water sanitation*

1. Improved Education Regarding Water-related Issues

In 2031, education will be improved significantly so that everyone, regardless of nationality or personal background, will have the chance to pursue his or her dreams. All children will enjoy the right to go to school with enough meals and water every day. In school, environment education will be one of the important subjects taught. Furthermore, people will be aware that water is vital to life and all communities will know about water-related issues and its consequences.

Our Actions by 2031

A. Individual/Community Actions:

- Spread awareness of water issues to communities allowing them to have better understanding of water as a precious resource.
- Organize more community involvement projects to educate people in developing and less developed countries on water management methods.
- Educate people about simple methods on water purification such as rainwater harvesting.

B. Governmental Actions:

- Increase the national budget to build more schools thus increasing access to education.
- Initiate compulsory education on water issues in every school to empower youths to think about how to use water sustainably.

2. Fair Distribution of Water

Fair distribution of water in both developed and developing countries will be achieved by 2031. Fair distribution is defined as every person receiving the minimum amount of water for human survival every day. Furthermore, industries will not violate the limits on the amount of water they are allowed to use. By this date, international leaders will be able to discuss their opinions and share their ideas on what is the best water distribution plan for their countries. This can be achieved through various actions on an international and local scale.

Our Actions by 2031

A. Individual Actions:

- Live by and encourage others to conserve and consume water wisely.

B. Business Actions:

- Treat industrial wastewater properly before disposing it into water bodies to reduce water pollution.

C. Governmental Actions:

- Achieve international cooperation by agreeing to a common consensus on the utilization of water resources.

3. Affordable Technology to Promote Water Sanitation

In 2031 we envision that all countries will have improved water sanitation. This will be available due to technologies such as water treatment centers. We will also have more advanced research in the field of water purification technologies. Thus, this allows all countries regardless of their economic status to have access to clean water.

Our Actions by 2031

A. Governmental Actions:

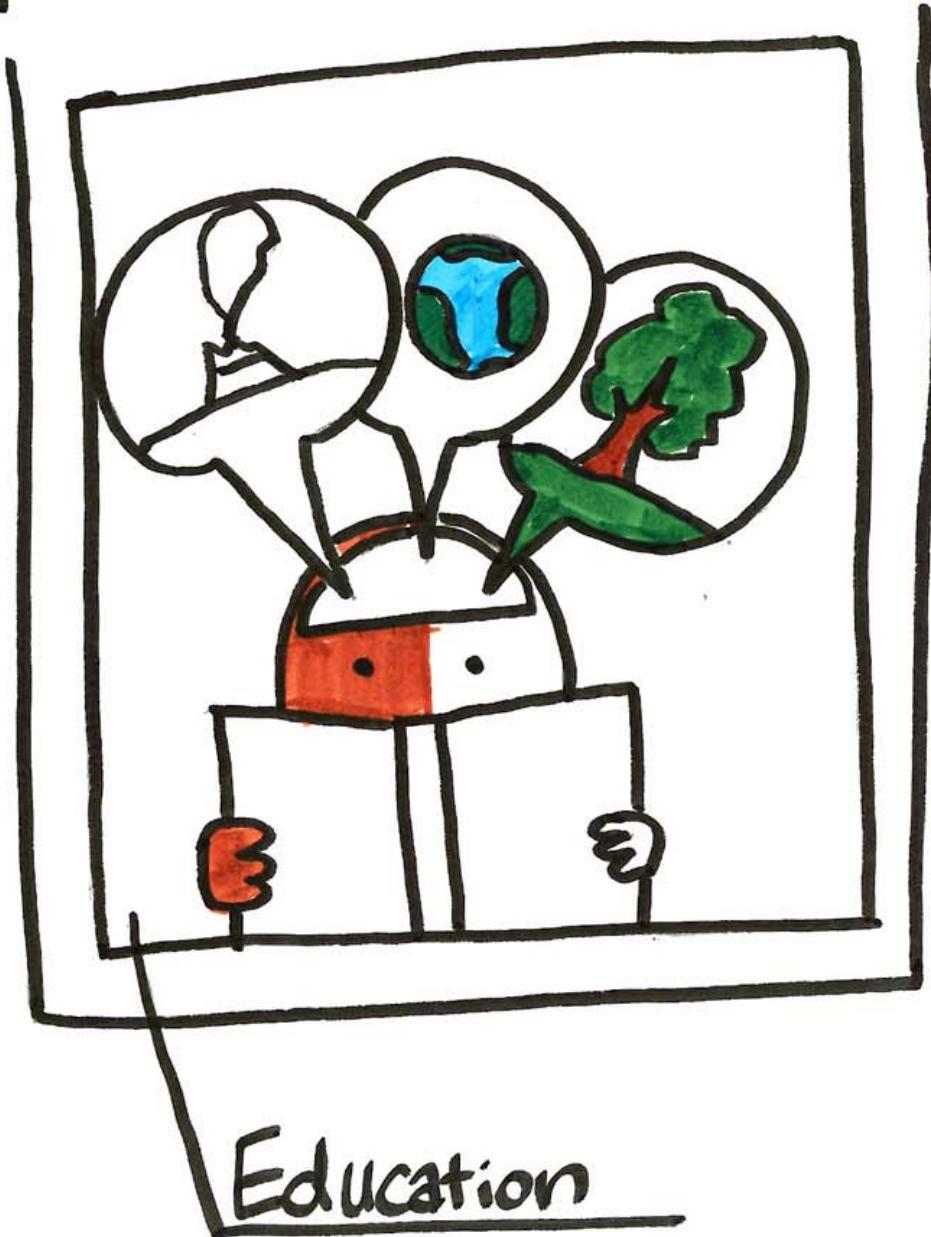
- Increase the national budget for water and environmental research to create cheaper and sustainable methods of water purification.

- Developed countries share their technologies and methods on how to obtain clean water with developing and less developed countries to ensure accessibility of water.
- Enact policies and stricter laws against polluters.

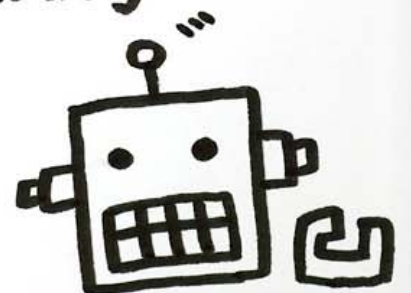

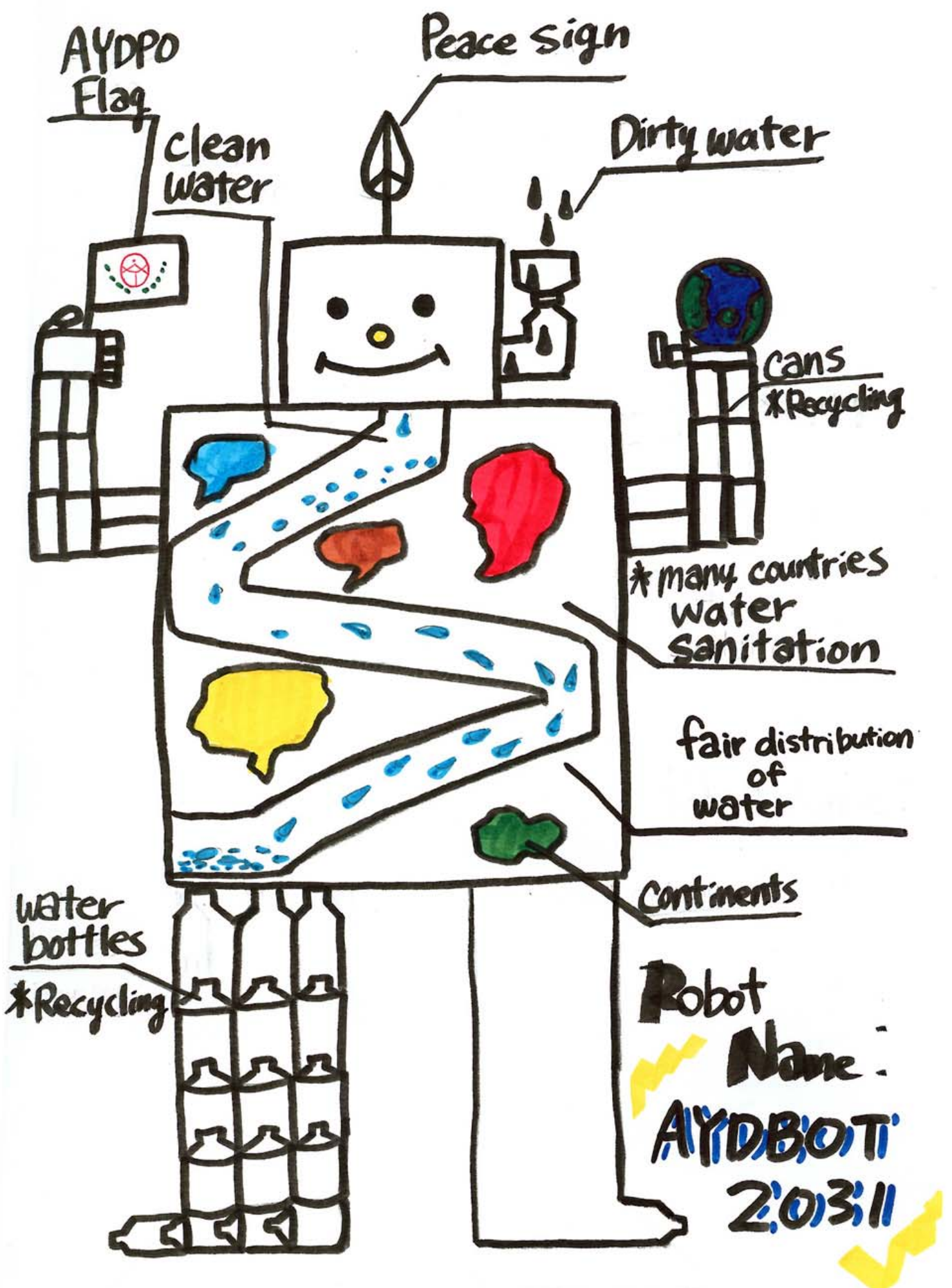
